

**RESOLUTION NO. 46-2017**

**INTRODUCED BY: MAYOR ANN MARIE DONEGAN**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES TO BE RENDERED DURING THE YEAR 2018 AND TO DIRECT THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER TO CREDIT THE CONSIDERATION PAYABLE UNDER SAID CONTRACT AND TO DEDUCT EQUIVALENT SUMS FROM TAX SETTLEMENTS DUE THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the Cuyahoga County General Health District performs essential health services for all communities of Cuyahoga County, including the City of Olmsted Falls, Ohio; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost of such services is paid by all participating subdivisions on a per capita basis, based on current population estimates. Now therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:**

**SECTION 1.** The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for public health services with the Cuyahoga County General Health District for the calendar year 2018, a copy of said contract being attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A", and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten.

**SECTION 2.** The Fiscal Officer of Cuyahoga County is hereby directed to credit the District Health Fund of Cuyahoga County the sum of Thirty-Seven Thousand One Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars (\$37,179.00) by deducting said amount from regular tax settlements to be made for the City of Olmsted Falls during the year 2018 in two (2) semi-annual installments of Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred Eighty-Nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$18,589.50) each.

**SECTION 3.** The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Cuyahoga County Auditor immediately upon its passage.

**SECTION 4.** That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council, and that deliberations of this Council and its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
