

ORDINANCE NO. 46-2018

INTRODUCED BY: Mayor James Graven & Council as a Whole

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND RATIFYING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT PROPOSAL TO THE MEMBER COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM (MCIP) OF THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT (NEORS) IN THE SUM OF \$1,090,500.00 FOR THE COOK/COLUMBIA SANITARY SEWER PROJECT (PHASE V) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS) maintains a Member Community Infrastructure Program (MCIP) for which member communities may apply for grant funding for use in construction projects addressing drainage issues; and

WHEREAS, the City of Olmsted Falls currently has begun the Cook/Columbia Sanitary Sewer Project to replace/rehabilitate infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the city of Olmsted Falls has submitted an application request to NEORS on or about June 11, 2018 for \$1,090,500 for the Cook/Columbia Sanitary Sewer Project in an attempt to further reduce property owner assessments; and

WHEREAS, additional funding for this project is available from the Community Cost Share Fund of NEORS for said project. Now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. City Council adopts and ratifies the submittal of an application to NEORS Member Community Infrastructure Program (MCIP) for funding in the sum of \$1,090,500.00 for the Cook/Columbia Sanitary Sewer Project.

SECTION 2. Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Olmsted Falls for the further reason that applications are currently under review by NEORS and time is of the essence for legislative approval of this application. Therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the affirmative vote of not

less than five (5) members elected to Council, and signature by the Mayor, or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
