

RESOLUTION NO. 68-2018

INTRODUCED BY: MAYOR JAMES GRAVEN AND COUNCIL AS A WHOLE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS FOR FUNDING FOR A PROJECT TO BE CONSIDERED BY THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SUPPLEMENTAL GRANT PROGRAM (CDSG) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018/2019 AND IF AWARDED, ACCEPTING SUCH GRANT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City has been advised by the Department of Development for the County of Cuyahoga that it is eligible to participate in a competitive application process for awarding of Community Development Supplemental Funds (Fiscal Year 2018/2019); and

WHEREAS, the city is permitted to submit one application, with the total amount of the request not exceeding \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined to apply for said supplemental grant funds for a public improvement project for wayfinding and community branding which will benefit the city; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing related to the City's participation in the Community Development Supplemental Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2018/2019 will be held by the City as outlined in the grant requirements. Now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. Having considered the above public hearing, the following project in the downtown area of the City is hereby designated as approved for use in the application to be submitted by the City in response to the competitive application process undertaken by the Department of Development of Cuyahoga County for Community Development Supplemental Grant Program funds. These supplemental funds will assist in the development of a study which will produce a Wayfinding Analysis Report, Community Brand Platform, Brand Identity Design, and Sign Program Design and Development.

SECTION 2. This study will lead to the creation of a branded, wayfinding system to support goals of navigation, economic development and safety with better signage and neighborhood recognition.

SECTION 3. The Mayor is authorized to submit the application on behalf of the City to the Department of Development of Cuyahoga County no later than the deadline requirement as stated in the grant application, and to accept such grant, if awarded.

SECTION 4. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council, and that deliberations of this Council and its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Olmsted Falls for the further reason that the admission will need to meet the deadline submission date as prescribed by Cuyahoga County. It shall therefore take effect immediately upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
