

RESOLUTION NO. 92-2019

AN RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO RENEW THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT AND THE CUYAHOGA SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT AND PUBLIC EDUCATION (PIPE) PROGRAM UNDER OHIO EPA MS4 PERMIT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Olmsted Falls has a permit through the Ohio EPA Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Discharge (MS4) Permit and pursuant to such permit and requirements, the City of Olmsted Falls is required to implement a public involvement and public education program; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District pursuant to agreement with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District, and for the benefit of the City of Olmsted Falls, have agreed that the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District can provide such PIPE service programs at a cost of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00), which will be reimbursed to the City through the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District. Now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to renew the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the City with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District and the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for purposes of providing PIPE programs for the benefit of the City.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Olmsted Falls and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to implement the education program required pursuant to the City's Municipal Separate Stormwater Discharge (MS4) Permit. It shall therefore take effect immediately upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
